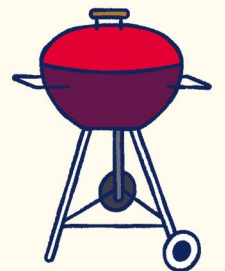

Pamber Parish Council update

The Council have used money provided by developers in the Parish to construct a wheelchair friendly path between the car park and beacon to allow, for the first time, access to Pamber Park for our less able bodied parishioners.

We have also used developer's contributions to install 4 pieces of exercise equipment in the Park to encourage us all to keep fit. Full instructions on its safe use are attached to the equipment.

Developer's contributions have also been used to purchase 4 new benches for the Parish, 2 of which are dedicated to all those who supported us through the Covid crisis. One of these will be installed in Beaches Crescent and the other in the Park. A wheelchair accessible picnic table will be one of the other benches installed in the Park.

The Council are currently investigating the purchase of notice boards, again funded from developer's contributions, to be placed in the Park giving guidance to the users of both the Park and Pamber Forest.

News from St Luke's Church

Welcome to some news about St Luke's Pamber Heath. We are part of the parish of Tadley and Pamber Heath under the leadership Of the Rector Revd Canon Richard Harlow. Our church remains closed for services but is open every Thursday and Saturday between 10:00 and 11:00am. At these times, there is a church member in the car park to meet with anyone for a chat, prayer or just to pass the time of day. We love meeting people there! During the 40 days of Lent before Easter we celebrated Jesus 3-year ministry including some of his miracles with symbols in the carpark and then on Good Friday there was a cross reminding of his death. The Easter Garden full of wonderful flowers and an open tomb celebrated the joy of Jesus rising from the dead.

The week after Easter, two much loved and long term members of Pamber Heath and St Luke's died. Wendy Alder died on the 7th April after a short illness borne with great courage and faith and the following day on the 8th April, Joy Wootton died after a 5 year illness borne with great fortitude and faith. Both Wendy and Joy taught me so much about dying with strong faith and no fear of death and with the wonderful support of love and care from their families and also their friends. We had services for each of them in St Luke's which, thanks to a wonderful friend, was decorated with two colourful pedestals. After St Luke's service, Wendy's coffin was taken for a service at St Mary's Silchester followed by burial in their graveyard. After Joy's service, there was a service with cremation at the West Berks Crematorium. A sad time for us as they leave a big hole in our church and village community but we thank God for their lives lived in faith with great love and with the belief that they are both now free from pain and at rest with Jesus in Heaven. We hope to have thanksgiving services for them later in the year so that the many people who would have liked to be at their funerals, can celebrate their lives. Our car park continues to be managed with care for the environment and with generous effort and help from neighbours and John. No-mow-May saw us leaving the grass uncut to encourage wildlife. The garden was decorated with floating helium balloons to celebrate Ascension day and with balloons decorated with flame ribbons for Pentecost (Whit Sunday) and is looking a mass of beautiful flowers whilst the building is adorned with flower-filled hanging baskets. We continue to support green living and are putting up cycle racks to encourage those who can, to cycle to church – 3 wheeled bikes are welcomed! We are starting to plan the commencement of our Thursday coffee mornings and Friday Toddler groups but we are progressing slowly and with care heeding government guidelines and common-sense. St Paul's, Tadley, is holding a 9:00am communion in church every Sunday and details of all our services will be on the parish website: www.stpaulstadley.org.uk
