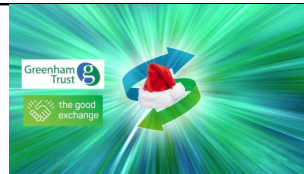
There will also be a virtual raffle on the day with a chance to win a Christmas hamper. To enter you must donate via the good exchange on the 11th December.

I am worried about going out to buy food

Most large supermarkets offer home delivery services and you can contact them to order food and book delivery slots to have your groceries delivered straight to your home.

Alternatively, you can ask a friend, relative or neighbour to do some food shopping for you.

I am worried about going out to collect my prescription

Your local pharmacy may offer a prescription delivery service. Give your pharmacy a call and see what support they can offer.

If your pharmacy doesn't offer this service you may want to use a different pharmacy or you can ask a friend, relative or neighbour to collect your prescription for you.

I don't have access to any support. Who do I contact?

The Hampshire Coronavirus Support and Helpline operates Monday to Thursday 9am to 5pm and Friday from 9am to 4.30pm. You can contact the helpline on **0333 370 4000** and someone will be able to provide you with advice or refer your request for support to the local community hub.





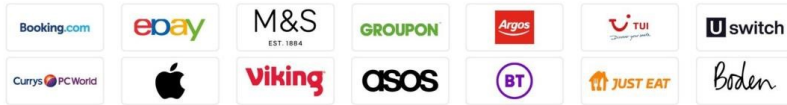

During the past months we have commented on numerous planning applications, been involved in the planned extension for Pamber Heath Memorial Hall, kept abreast of developments at the affordable housing for local people site in Pamber Heath Road and are currently progressing exciting developments in Pamber Park including improving disabled access and seating and installing fitness equipment funded by S.106 money received from developments in the Parish.

Work on the Neighbourhood Plan continues and we have commented on the Borough proposals for their new Local Plan.

The joint Speedwatch scheme with Mortimer West End Council is now up and running and we hope it will have the desired effect of persuading motorists to observe speed limits throughout our parishes.
